Jain Social Group (Emerald) Jaipur and Rotary Club Jaipur Midtown appreciated PCE for continuously contributing in blood donation. Doctors shared the knowledge and information on need, facts and benefits of

blood donation. They also emphasized myths and truths of blood donation.

PCE was played to give the message of blood donation. The inauguration ceremony came to an end with the vote of thanks by Mr. Amit Gupta (Chief Proctor, PCE) who heartily expressed his gratitude towards Doctors, Blood Banks, and Jaipur and blessed and wished a very good health to all the blood donors. The problem can be addressed if an additional two percent of Indians donate blood, as opened by the Health experts. We need 12 million units of blood every year but just about nine million units are being donated. While addressing first time donors at the camp our volunteers brought awareness in them about shortage of blood and why we must donate blood every year, to help the persons requiring blood. Blood donation can save lives of innumerable persons. Donation of blood is very critical and crucial for saving lives many patients and those who have met with accidents. It is as such a great service or contribution to the society and people living in it.

Objectives of voluntary Blood Donation Drives:

- To replace paid blood donors with voluntary donors;


♦ **DETAILS OF ACTIVITY:**



DETAILS OF TECHNOLOGICAL / PRACTICAL LEARNINGS:

Women are the core of the existence of any and every part of the universe. It is indispensable to overlook their valuable contribution. Keeping in pace with the present requisites, IETE propose-week a training program on "Internet Uses" under the banner of 'Digital India'. "A great endeavor requires expert guidance." A one-day workshop activity was organized by the department of Electronics and Communication Engineering, Poornima College of Engineering on 24th July 2017. This was a noble effort supported by Dr. Om Prakash Sharma, Director, Poornima College of Engineering, and Dr. Garima Mathur, Head Department of Electronics and Communication Engineering in which 7 students of 3rd year, Khushboo Chhabra, Jyoti Singh, Laksh, Prashant, Arya Rawat, Ayushi Parashar, Divya along with 3 faculty members, Gaurav Saxena, Manish Kumar Sharma, Anila Dhingra visited Chaksu village. In Chaksu, they went to the school Unique Shine Children Academy. Our efforts for creating were mutually supported by Mr. Trilok Kumar Sharma, Principal of Unique Shine Children Academy.

This was a women-centric activity that aimed to enlighten urban/rural housewives about the wonders that internet technology offers in easing day-to-day life. The students gave PowerPoint presentations about the use of various policies of government such as Net Banking, Aadhar card, and Bhamashah card i.e., how they can be useful to smoothen daily life. Students also created awareness among the women about the uses and the bits of internet banking in rural areas. Students told them about:

- **Net Banking:** Net banking also known as internet banking, e-banking or virtual banking, is an electronic payment system that enables customers of a bank or other financial institution to Conduct a range of financial transactions through the financial institution's website. The online banking system typically connects to be part of the core banking system operated by a bank and

is in contrast to branch banking which was the traditional way customers accessed banking services. Women in rural areas were not aware of thinking and how to transfer their money from one account to another account.

- **Aadhar card:** Students told them what aadhar card is; The Aadhaar UID Card is produced and distributed by the Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI). It is the largest personal identification program the world has ever witnessed. Over 1.2 billion people are eligible to receive the Aadhaar card. The only requirement to be eligible for an Aadhaar card is that every person must be a permanent resident of India. They told them what the importance of Aadhar card is and why it is needed for everyone.
- **Bhamashah Card:** Bhamashah Yojana is a scheme introduced by the Government of Rajasthan to transfer financial and non-financial benefits of governmental schemes directly to recipients in a transparent way. Education is not only an instrument of enhancing efficiency but also an effective tool of augmenting and widening democratic participation and upgrading the overall quality of individuals and Society. India has a vast population and to capture the potential demographic dividend, and remove acute regional, social, and gender imbalances, the Government and various private organizations are committed making concerted efforts for improving the quality of education in rural areas for women.
- Women's education in ancient India was quite good but in the middle age has deteriorated because of restrictions against women. However, again it is getting better and better day by day as modern people in India understand that without the growth and development of women, the development of the country is not possible. It then is very true that equal growth of both males and females will increase development in every area of the country.

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
