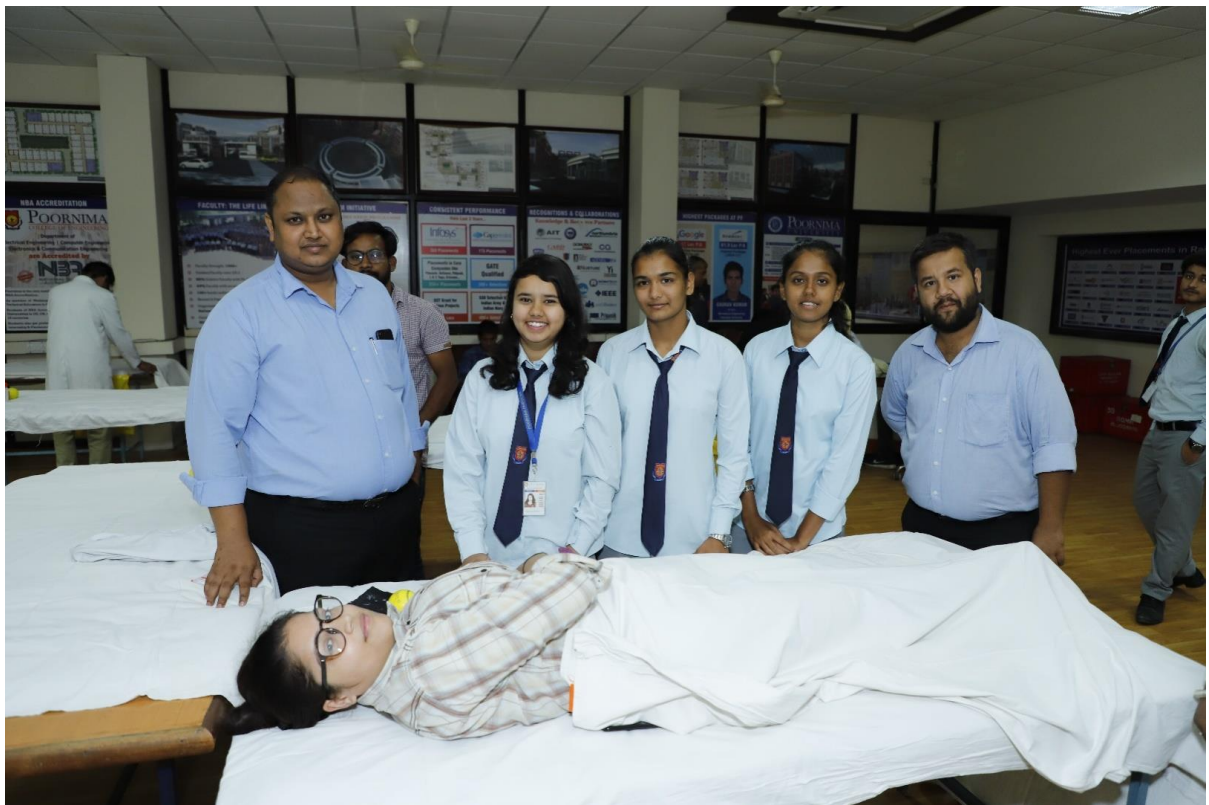

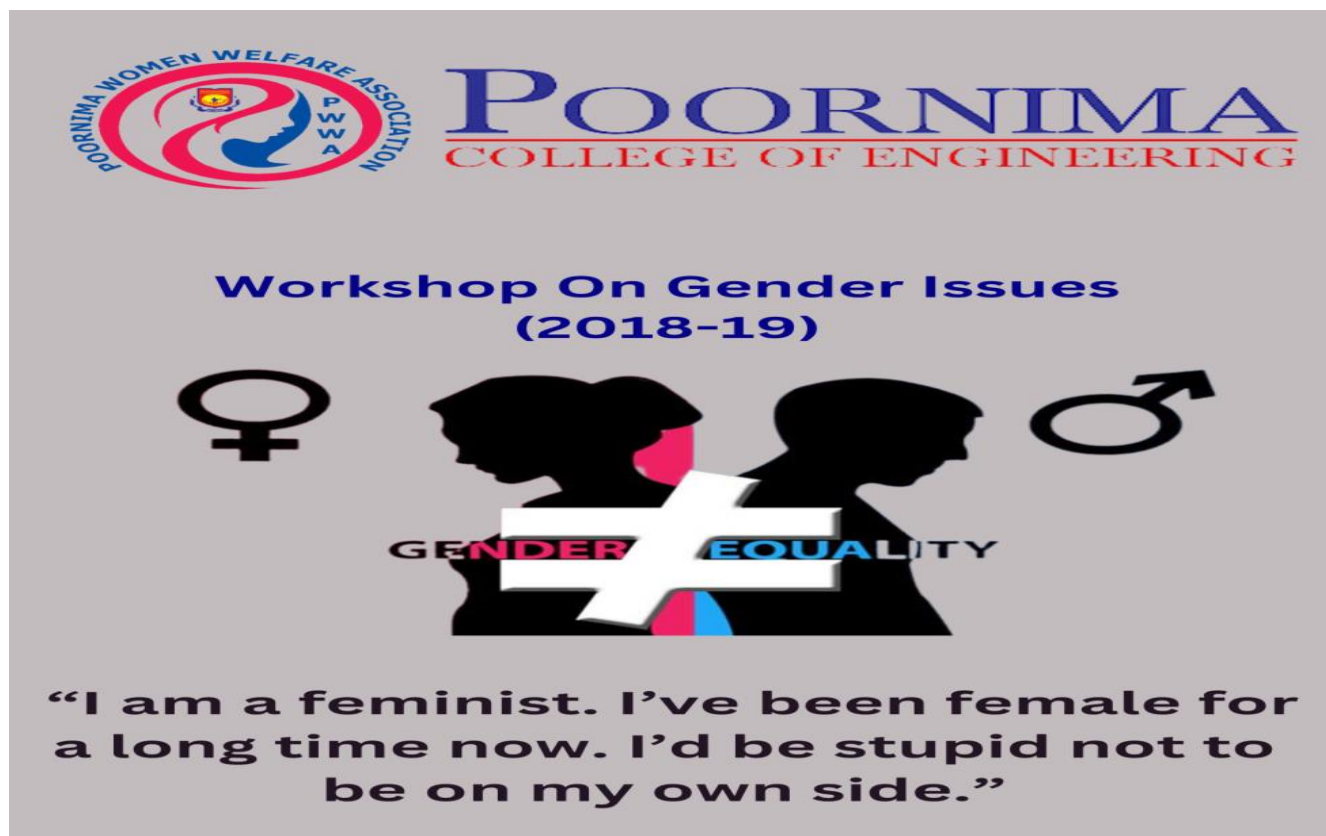
DESCRIPTION OF THE EVENTS

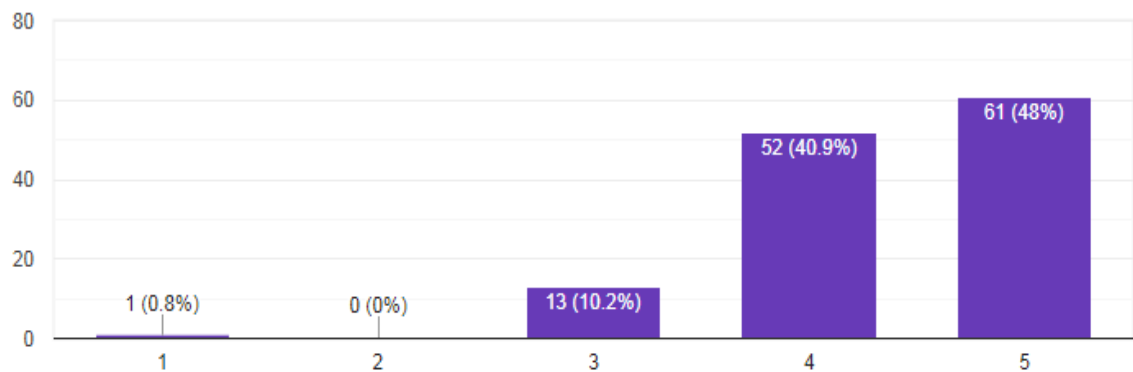

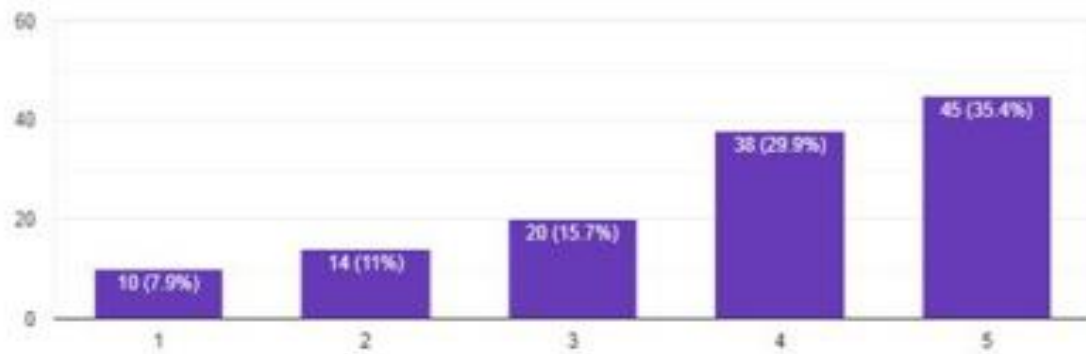

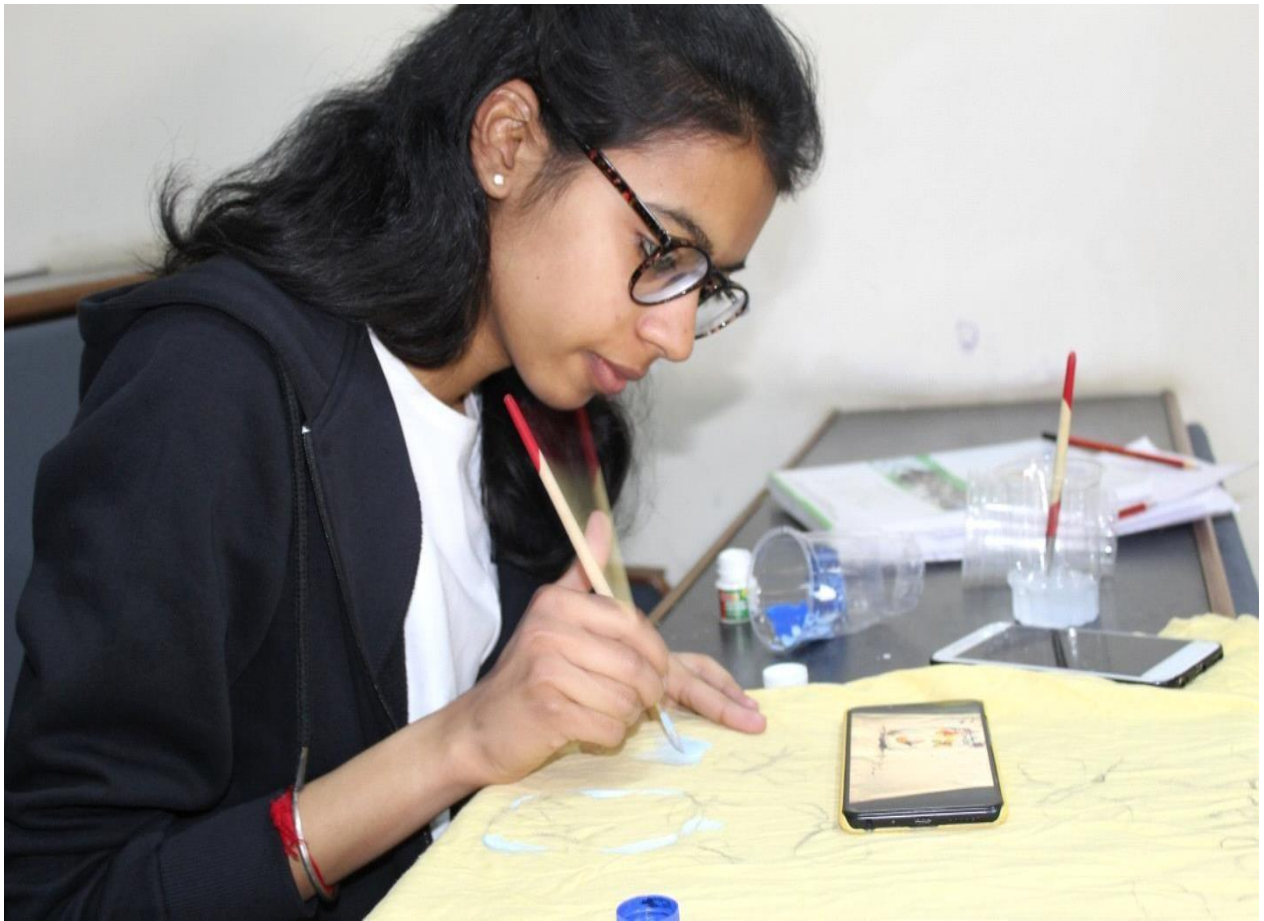
