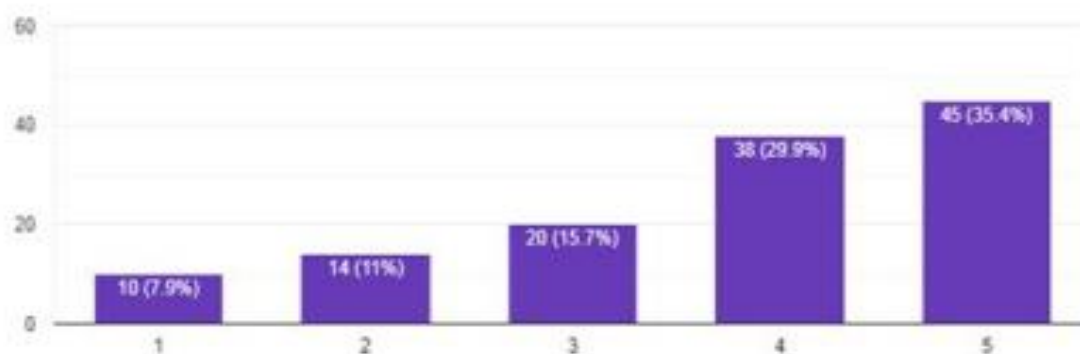

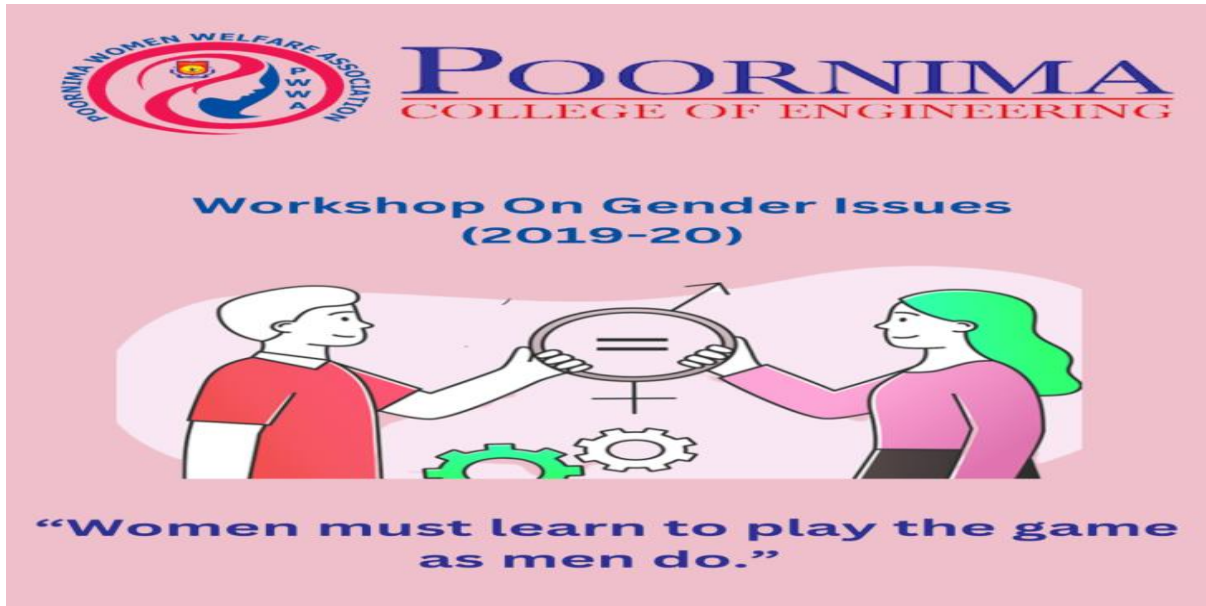
DESCRIPTION OF THE EVENTS

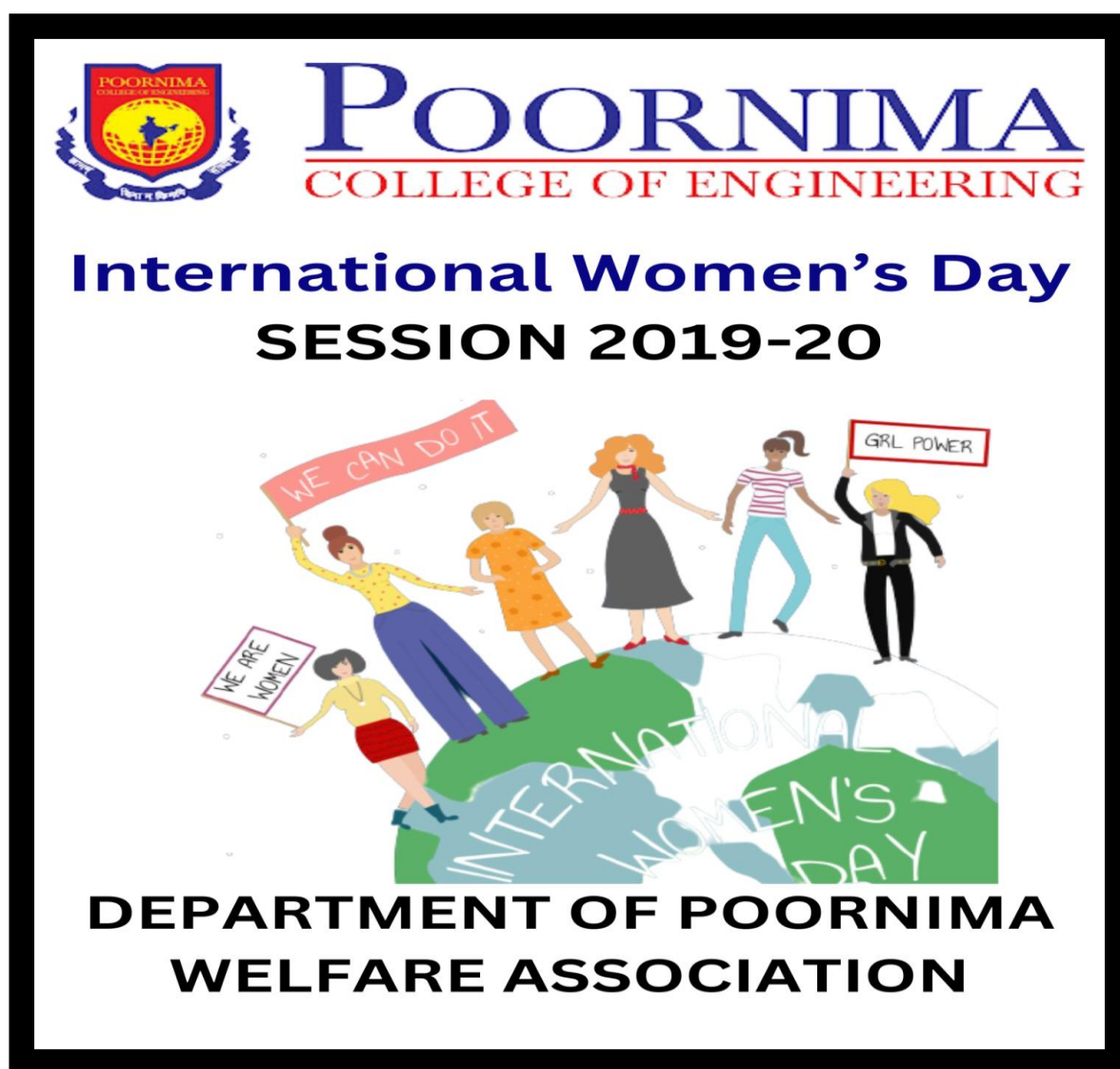
