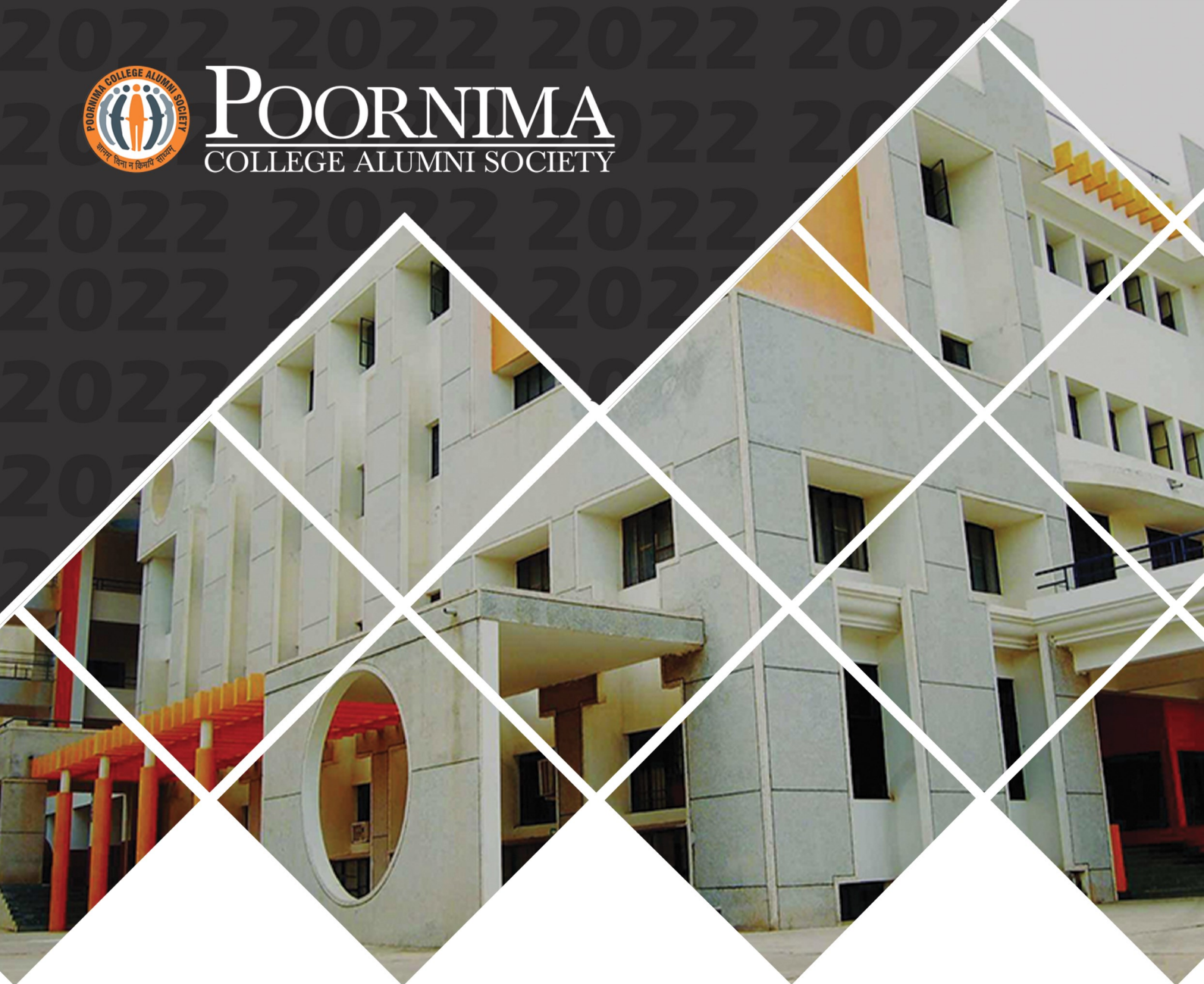

Devsecops-Appsec Future

Today, online applications have become more prone to attacks, leaks, exploits, and new kind of vulnerabilities. DevSecOps is a cultural shift in the software industry that tries to include security into the rapid release cycle specific to modern application development and deployment. When developers leverage the right set of tools, they can catch security issues early, resulting in cost optimization. As security tooling shifts toward being integrated into DevOps workflows, more and more development teams are taking ownership of running and automating security tools and tests. Eliminating repetitive manual work of security team made security testers results with higher productivity. Also helpful to keep up with the pace of modern development. Methods like SAST ,DAST and vulnerability scanning are employed at different stages of pipeline to test the applications thoroughly. Developers are becoming much more security oriented, as are the development tools that come with security features included. Shift left testing integrates testing fusion of security-practices as early as possible in the CI/CD pipeline.

Covid 19 Impact – The Future Work Is Already

Workplaces can be broadly classified in two types, ones requiring close interpersonal (on-site) interactions (like factories, medical care, retail, travel, hotels etc.) and others in which the workers mostly work on computers and interactions can be digital.

Pandemic made companies evolve faster—

Covid-19 pandemic has changed the way we all work, and it has pushed the companies and consumers to adopt new behaviors like more digitization of all processes; it is here to stay however will continue to evolve. The workplaces which require more physical proximity has seen accelerated adoption of automation, robotics and AI as the companies look to reduce dependence of employees coming to work and meet surge in demand (due to more trade moving to e-commerce). This will pose a risk to jobs which require low skills and customer sales/service roles. Demand for employees in STEM jobs would see a growth reflecting need for more automation and tech solutions.

Work from home –

Perhaps the most obvious impact of the pandemic is employees working remotely. Remote work has allowed companies to tap into talent in tier 2 and tier 3 cities and to those who were unable to relocate to big cities due to personal reasons, hence creating more opportunities for such employees. Adoption of digital technologies like virtual meetings, collaboration tools would mean more demand for these products and hence companies need to focus on upskilling their existing employees for new ways of working.

While most of the work can be done remotely, some are more effective when done in person like brainstorming, negotiations, critical decisions, onboarding new employees etc. Therefore, we see companies are now shifting towards Hybrid ways of working where employees primarily work from home and come to offices for collaboration and critical meetings.

Hybrid is the future –

While work from home provides flexibility to employees to manage their personal as well as work commitments as per their convenience, however we are social creatures by nature, we depend on each other for everything, employees find meaning & comfort in meeting their teammates and discussing work related matters; hence companies are now ensuring they provide enough avenues for teams to meet at regular frequencies.

Both companies and employees have shown extraordinary flexibility and adaptability in responding to the pandemic with innovation and empathy, they will continue to evolve the workforce in ways that will lead to a brighter future of work.

Big Data Analytics

Big data analytics examines large amounts of data to uncover hidden patterns, corrections, and other insights. With today's technology, it's possible to analyze your data and get answers from it almost {immediately—an effort that's slower and less efficient than more traditional business intelligence solutions. “The concept of big data has been around for years; most organizations now understand that if they capture all the data that streams into their businesses, they can apply analytics and get significant value from it. But even in the 1950s, decades before anyone uttered the term “big data”, businesses were using basic analytics to uncover insights and trends. The new benefits that big data analytics brings to the table, however, are speed and efficiency. Whereas a few years ago a business would have gathered information, run analytics, and unearthed information that could be used for future decisions, today that businesses can identify insights for immediate decisions. The ability to work faster and stay agile gives organizations a competitive edge they didn't have before. Big Data got a major value while helping organization in:

1. Cost reduction. Big data technologies such as Hadoop and cloud-based analytics bring significant cost advantages when it comes to storing large amounts of data plus they can identify more efficient 'ways of doing business.
2. New products and services. With the ability to gauge customer needs and satisfaction through analytics comes the power to give customers what they want.

Davenport points out that with big data analytics, more companies are creating new products to meet 'customers' needs, Entire business sectors are being reshaped by big data. In fact, with the "right mindset, data can be cleverly used to become a foundation of innovation and new services. 'Big data analytics applications enable big data analysts, data scientists, predictive modelers, statisticians, and other analytics professionals to analyze growing volumes of structured transaction data, pls other forms of data that are often left untapped by conventional BI and analytics programs. Driven by specialized analytics systems and software, big 'data analytics offers various business benefits, including: New revenue opportunities, more effective marketing, better customer service, Improved operational efficiency.
